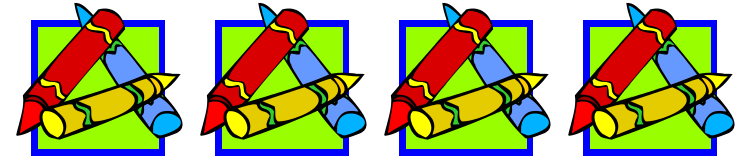

Entrance Ages 2023-2024

Student must have been born between September 2, 2018 and June 2, 2019

Child must have been born on or before September 1, 2018

First Grade

Child must have been born on or before September 1, 2017

A Few Things You Can Do to Prepare Your Child for Kindergarten

Begin teaching letters, shapes, colors, and numbers. Practice counting with your child.

Provide group playtime to your child get used to sitting, listening, following directions, and sharing.

Make shopping for school a fun experience. Get a list from the school of supplies needed, and let your child make choices about colors for pencil cases and backpacks.

Practice getting to school a couple weeks before school actually begins to get the routine and timing down. Start the school year bedtime a month before school begins.

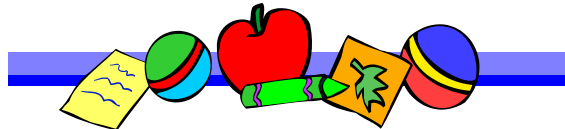
Read with your child every day. (When reading, ask questions, have him/her retell the story, and draw pictures of the main character.)

Purchase clothing with independence in mind. Students should be able to snap, button, zip, and buckle by themselves.

Backpacks need to be large enough to hold a 12" x 13" folder; otherwise, important papers and work could be lost. Rolling backpacks are discouraged due to space issues.

Before starting school in August label your child's belongings: snack containers, backpacks, coats, sweaters, etc.

Establish some routines around the house and give your child the opportunity to complete simple tasks. This will help out with the structure and establishment of routines when class begins in August.



Important Enrollment Information

- ***Burbank residents*** can enroll their elementary-aged children at their school of residence online (www.burbankusd.org) beginning January 23, 2023. Registration supporting documents should be uploaded into AERIES or emailed to the school.
- ***Intra-district permits*** are for Burbank residents who wish their child to attend a school other than their school of residence. Please contact the Student Services Department at (818) 729-4512 or (818) 729-4467 for more information about these permits. Requests are available for 30 days in the spring only.
- ***Inter-district Permits*** are for non-Burbank residents who are either employed full-time in the City, own and operate a business in Burbank or have childcare needs that are served in the City. Please contact the Student Services Department at (818) 729-4512 or (818) 729-4467 for more information about these permits.

Items Required for Enrollment

All four of the below items are required in order to enroll a student.

- Original Burbank utility bill for the current month.
- Child's official birth certificate with seal or other legal documentation verifying the age of the child.
- Complete immunization records from birth to present. Verification of immunization for measles, mumps, rubella, polio, DTP, Hepatitis B, and Varicella.
- Parent photo identification.
