Financial Aid News and Scholarship Updates

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the universal application for determining financial need-based aid for higher education. This application is completely free and every student applying to college should apply! The FAFSA filing period for future freshmen term of 2020/2021 is now open and the priority deadline is March 2, 2020. Computer access is available to students in the college and career center before school, lunch and afterschool for those students that would like to work on their FAFSA applications.



Remember that the FAFSA application is used for FA from the federal government including the CAL grant, Pell Grant and financial aid from colleges as well.
