Also, please remember that the FAFSA priority deadline is coming up on March 2, 2020.

Class of 2021 – Juniors! Start to get ready for the SAT or ACT by visiting www.collegeboard.org or www.act.org. These websites will help you get more information on both the SAT/ACT and provide you with information on how to register for the upcoming spring test dates. If you think that you qualify for a fee waiver please make sure to see your counselor as well. Study now to ensure your success on these tests! Remember to also submit at least your 10 service learning hours by the end of this semester!
