- Applicants must be in 11<sup>th</sup> or 12<sup>th</sup> grade when they fill out an application and have a birth date on or before 4/1/04 OR meet any other older age requirement of the facility that they are applying to. (See Application for specific information)
- The Program is best described as a medical mentorship/internship.
- Under the supervision of a medical facility coordinator, selected participants shadow various medical professionals (nurse, nutritionist, pharmacist, lab technician and/or physician etc.).
- Most involved medical facilities run their programs Monday – Friday, about 8 hours a day, no nights or weekends; exact hours are determined by each medical facility coordinator.
- If selected, participants are responsible for their own transportation.
- If a financial need exists, a participant may request a stipend.
