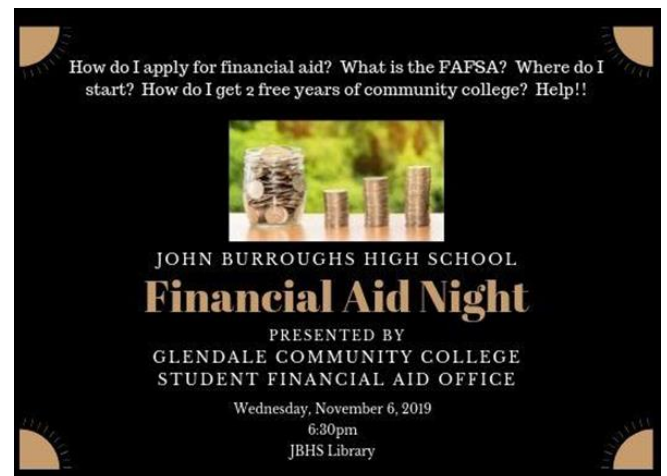

FAFSA Application and Due Date Information

The Federal Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is due on **March 2, 2020**. Coolidge scholars are selected based primarily on academic excellence and on their interest in public policy, an appreciation for and understanding of the values President Coolidge championed, as well as humility and service.
