We are excited to welcome more students and employees back to campus safely on Monday, April 12. This is the next step in our journey to return all students to campus full-time. Over the next seven weeks, we will be able to maintain our morning Distance Learning sessions for all students, and in the afternoons we will offer in-person supports for students who selected the hybrid model. The afternoon sessions will provide in-person instructional support and other student supports for behavior and/or social-emotional needs. The purpose is to engage students so that they benefit from the supplemental instruction. Each school site will be communicating additional details directly with you regarding the return to school. We are also excited to hear about the plans announced by Governor Gavin Newsom to fully reopen California's economy by [June 15](#) if vaccine supply remains sufficient and hospitalization rates stay low. In his announcement, Governor Newsom stated that schools should plan to conduct full-time, in-person instruction in the fall, in compliance with Cal/OSHA emergency temporary standards and public health guidelines. We will continue to learn and refine our practices over the next several weeks so that we are ready to reopen fully in the fall.
