



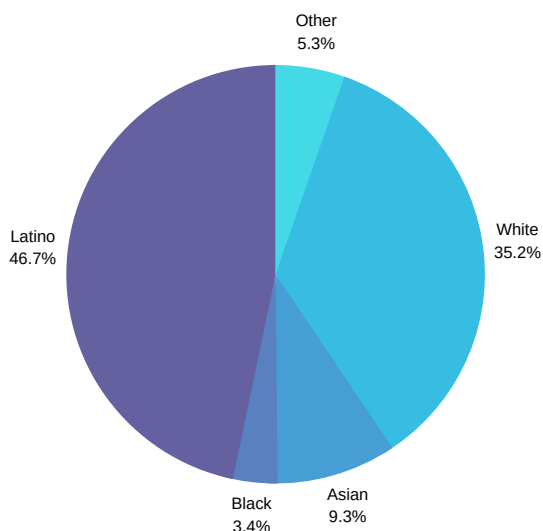

## JBHS AT-A-GLANCE

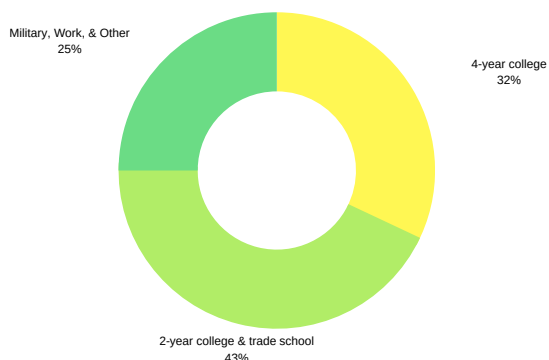
- Total Enrollment: Approximately 2,450 students
- Grades served: 9-12
- Semester system (Fall, Spring, & Summer)
- Each course receives 5 credits per semester.
- A grade of "D" or higher receives credit.
- 230 credits required to graduate
- With COVID-19, the 2020-21 school year started with 100% distance learning. Students attended 3 classes per day for 80 minutes per class. Previously, the school was shut down as of March 13, 2020 and all students were required to continue their classes receiving CR (credit) or NC (no credit).

## MEDICAL



The JBHS Medical Academy is a four-year program designed for students to get a taste of what's going on in the medical field and how they can be a part of helping heal people.
