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## 2022—2023 School Profile

**The Community:** Burbank is composed of a middle and working class population of 104,700. Currently, the district consists of 11 elementary schools, 3 middle schools, 2 comprehensive high schools, 1 continuation high school, and 1 online academy.

**The School:** Burbank High School is a public, four year high school for grades 9-12. Founded in 1908, Burbank High School is located on the northeast corner of the San Fernando Valley.

**Accreditation:** Burbank High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges and holds membership in the College Board.

**Curriculum:** Burbank High School offers a strong college preparatory program, which includes a number of Honors and Advanced Placement courses. The school also provides a vast array of UC approved courses, allowing its students to meet UC "A — G" requirements and compete for college admission within California and beyond. In addition, the school community offers Career and Technical Education programs and a wide range of extracurricular activities.

**\*Key Information for 20-21 school year:** Due to COVID-19, Burbank students were enrolled in Distance Learning. Each class met twice a week for a total of 100 minutes of synchronous learning and 60 minutes of asynchronous learning. Asynchronous assignments were completed every Friday for each class.

**Student Body:** The 2022—2022 enrollment is approximately 2,507 students, 558 of those students make up the senior class. The high school is made up of a large variety of ethnic groups.

**Class Rank:** Each senior class at Burbank High School is ranked by their academic GPA. For the fall semester, rank is calculated using grades earned freshman through junior year, weighing all AP classes, and selected honors classes. The rank is then recalculated in January, including grades from the Fall semester for final ranking.

**Transcript Information:** "P" denotes courses certified by the University of California. "H" denotes honors courses. "AP" denotes Advanced Placement courses. "\*" denotes weighted grades. Students are expected to take the AP exam if in an AP course. Academic GPA excludes PE classes. Total GPA includes PE classes. Burbank chose Credit/No Credit grading for spring 2020. Graduates met state requirements. Students were able to make grade changes for Fall 2020 through summer 2021 utilizing AB104 (A,B,C, and D grades could be changed to "P" and F grades could be changed to "NP". These grades would not be used for GPA calculations).
